

ANTI-CORRUPTION REPORT MONGOLIA H1 2022



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COOPERATIONS **AGAINST CORRUPTION**

We cooperated with the following organizations in anticorruption awareness activities and organized events and other activities aimed at target groups:

"Your rights and participation - say no against corruption" enlightenment event was organized in Capital city, Baganuur and Nalaikh districts, Govisumber, Darkhan-Uul, Selenge, Bulgan, and Orkhon aimags. A total of 3,219 people participated in these events.



Anti-corruption campaign materials were distributed to citizens.



Legal advice was given to citizens during the enlightenment event "Your rights and participation - say no against corruption".

1,171,608 citizens

participated in Anti-Corruption Law promotion, counseling, information dissemination, and training events organized jointly with the Capital and District Civic Chambers and Legal Assistance Centers.

Provided professional assistance and organized training for the activities of the "Justice Club" established in 7 schools in the Capital city and 3 schools in Khentii aimag.



In cooperation with the International Children's Complex "Nairamdal", the event "Being honest is the best" was organized, and more than

400 children who were vacationing in the complex participated in the event.

The event "Your rights, your participation: Youth will not tolerate corruption"

was organized in cooperation with the military units of the Special force's command of the General Staff of the Armed Forces, students of the National Defense University, the University of Internal Affairs, and the National University of Mongolia.

We supported and guided the organization of the campaign
"Integrity is Always the Right Option" organized by the
People's Representatives' Meeting, the Governor's Office, and the Crime Prevention
Branch Councils of Uvurkhangai, Khuvsqul, and Dornogovi aimags.

In cooperation with the Mongolian Football Association, the event "Right judgment - Fair game" was organized for the citizens. **More than 1,500 people** participated in the event.

In cooperation with the Ministry of Digital Development and Communications and E-Mongolia Academy, the event "Digital Services without bureaucracy" was organized and 600 people participated.

In cooperation with the General Department of Education, a curriculum competition was organized among general education teachers, and **15 programs** were selected in two stages from **251 submitted programs** in the categories of elementary, middle, and high school, and prizes were awarded to the participants.

PROMOTIONS AGAINST CORRUPTION

The following activities were organized to educate the public against corruption, promote anti-corruption laws, and explain the dangers of corruption to society:

Short video contents on the topics of "Wallet", "E-learning", "Choice", "Karma doesn't mistake the address", and 11 other video stories about good practices and justice were created as part of the campaign "Integrity is Always the Right Option" and displayed on street LED screens and distributed to the public through online television stations.

These video contents are distributed to citizens through a total of **9 cinemas** in the Capital city and Darkhan-Uul and Orkhon aimags.





"One Drop" anti-corruption content is prepared and distributed to listeners in cooperation with "MGL" radio.

Mongolian National Broadcaster – MNB prepares and distributes the "News of the IAAC" program throughout the country.







Stickers were distributed to citizens and civil servants with content urging them to report corruption.

A total of **72,900 books, manuals, and brochures** were published and distributed to spread the idea of justice and promote laws and regulations to citizens.

40,000 train tickets have been issued with an advertisement of special number 110 for receiving information about corruption crimes and infringements.

Enlightening videos and content were regularly broadcast on the screens located in the elevators of 228 apartments and offices, reaching 2,930,270 people in 14,294 households.

Information boards with anti-corruption contents were placed in **816 entrances** of apartments and townships in 5 sub-districts of 2 districts of the Capital city and delivered to **70,964 citizens** of **20,471 households**.

The distribution of video content for target groups is being organized through websites, pages, and television stations.

In collaboration with <u>Urug.mn</u> website, discussions were held on the topics of "Is it correct to resolve corruption cases in a simplified manner" and "<u>Penalty policy for corruption crimes</u>" with the participation of experts and researchers.

We are developing the Facebook page **Авлигатай тэмцэх газар**, which aims to publicize anti-corruption activities and disseminate accurate news and information from real sources, and the Facebook page **АТГ-Олон нийтийн төв**, which aims to raise awareness of the dangers of corruption in society and inculcate zero tolerance for corruption. Followers on these Facebook pages increased by **20,394 people**.

A total of **296 news articles** were added to the Facebook page Авлигатай тэмцэх газар, reaching **2,231,242 people**. An average of **13,048 people** received anti-corruption news and information **per day**. The number of followers increased by **8,642 people** to **32,971**.

A total of **308 news items** were posted on the Facebook page **АТГ-Олон нийтийн төв,** reaching **3,097,413 people.** An average of **18,114 people** received anti-corruption information **per day.** The number of followers increased from **11,752** to **59,467 followers.**

ANTI-CORRUPTION TRAINING

The IAAC regularly organized training for citizens and government officials aimed at preventing corruption and conflicts of interest, raising awareness of the dangers of corruption, and improving the responsibilities of officials.

The traditional and stereotyped methods of training for public officials have been changed, and the training has been organized in the form of discussion and exchange of opinions based on the study of cases of common errors and violations in the country.

REVIEW OF RULES AND REGULATIONS

During the reporting period, 26 decisions, rules, and

regulations approved by authorized persons were reviewed, and 21 of them did not meet the general and special requirements of the normative act. Therefore, 10 proposals for total repeal of the rules and regulations, 6 proposals for partial repeal, 1 proposal for amendment, and 5 proposals for registration in the state register of administrative norms were submitted to authorized organizations and officials. According to these proposals, 2 decisions have been annulled and 1 decision has been changed by the law.

By the Anti-Corruption Law, the code of conduct of employees of 4 state and state-owned organizations such as the Ulaanbaatar Thermal Network and the Third Thermal Power Plant was reviewed and relevant suggestions were submitted.

RECOMMENDATIONS ON PREVENTING CORRUPTION

Recommendations were given to the following organizations and officials in the areas of eliminating the causes and conditions of corruption, stopping the acts of corruption, eliminating the consequences, providing public services without bureaucracy and delays, improving the ethics of employees, and improving internal control over them:

ACTIONS TO ELIMINATE THE CAUSES AND CONDITIONS OF CORRUPTION

Recommendations are being developed to eliminate the causes of corruption in the state-owned joint-stock company Cement and Lime located in Selenge aimag. In the first half of 2022, the IAAC analyzed the performance of **16 statements** sent by detectives to legal entities to eliminate the causes and conditions that contributed to the occurrence of crimes. Based on this analysis, effective measures were taken along the lines of **4 statements**, and the causes and conditions of corruption were eliminated. No effective action was taken following other reports. Therefore, recommendations and requirements are submitted to those 5 organizations.

The implementation of **11 requirements** submitted to the authorities and officials to ensure the implementation of laws and to impose responsibility on public officials who violated the laws and regulations was monitored.

RESEARCH ON CORRUPTION SITUATIONS

The Corruption Risk Assessments were organized and presented at the Ministry of Environment and Tourism, the General Authority of State Registration, the Mongolian Railways state-owned company, and the Land Management Office of Bayanzurkh district.

The following researches were conducted during the first half of the year:

- Integrity assessment of the Ministries, agencies, and local Governors' offices
- Children's integrity survey
- Research on the status of the services provided by khoroos to the citizens and the records and statistics of the citizens who have applied to khoroo
- Research work on developing a methodology for monitoring and evaluating the results of enlightenment activities
- Research work to determine methods and forms of enlightenment activities that are compatible with the customs, traditions, life and culture of Mongolians
- Research work on the development of the strategy of enlightenment activities to be organized by the IAAC in 2022-2024
- Study on the results and importance of public relations and enlightenment activities organized by the Anti-Corruption Agency







A compendium of information and research articles was published entitled "Anti-Corruption Action: Worldwide".



A semiannual "Justice" theoretical and methodological journal was published.

DECLARATION OF PERSONAL **INTERESTS, ASSETS, AND** INCOME

The IAAC conducted the nationwide renewal of the Declaration of Personal Interests, Assets and Income (DPIAI) for 2021 of the officials who are covered by the Anti-Corruption Law, the Law on the Regulation of Public and Private Interests, and Prevention of Conflict of Interest in Public Service. Within the legal deadline for renewing DPIAI, or by February 15, 2021, 44,554 deposing people of 120 state and local administrative organizations submitted and confirmed their applications within legal deadline.

To ensure the grounds outlined in Articles 14.1, 14.2, and 14.3 of the Anti-Corruption Law, to ensure transparency and accountability of civil servants, and to provide public access to information, the summary of the DPIAI of state and local administrative officials posted openly on the website http://www.xacxom.iaac.mn.

RISKS IN THE DPIAI INFORMATION

DPIAI inspection was organized on the basis of risk, and as part of calculating the results, the risk was calculated for the information of **42,657 officials** of DPIAI. According to risk analysis, there were **6,895 (16.2%) officials** with medium or high-risk, including a high percentage of public officials of the following organizations:

An analysis of the job functions of **74 state-owned companies, enterprises, subsidiaries, and affiliates** revealed that there are **404 positions** at risk of corruption and conflict of interest.

Therefore, managing the budget and assets, issuing, canceling, and suspending permits and authorizations for certain activities, managing an independent unit for the implementation of certain government services, making decisions within the scope of his authority, concluding contracts, conducting inspections, and organizing tenders The Cabinet Secretariat of Government, State Property Policy and Regulation Agency, Ministry of Energy, Ministry of Roads and Transportation, Ministry of Mining and Heavy Industry, Ministry of Finance, Ministry of Food, Agriculture and Light Industry, "Ulaanbaatar Railway" joint-stock community, "Erdenes Five Tolgoi" JSC, "Erdenes Mongolia" JSC delivered to its affiliated organizations. As a result, about 500 officials who depose the above functions have to declarations.

INSPECTION OF THE DPIAI

In the first half of 2022, **315 officials** DPIAI were resolved. Compared to the same period of the previous year, the number of declarations received increased by **140 (1.1 times more)**, and the number of declarations resolved increased by **120 (50.0%)**.

In terms of planned inspections, senior officials of the Mongolian Customs Agency, Customs division at Ulaanbaatar city, Customs division at Shiveekhuren, and Customs division at Gashuunsukhait, **152 applicants** were inspected.

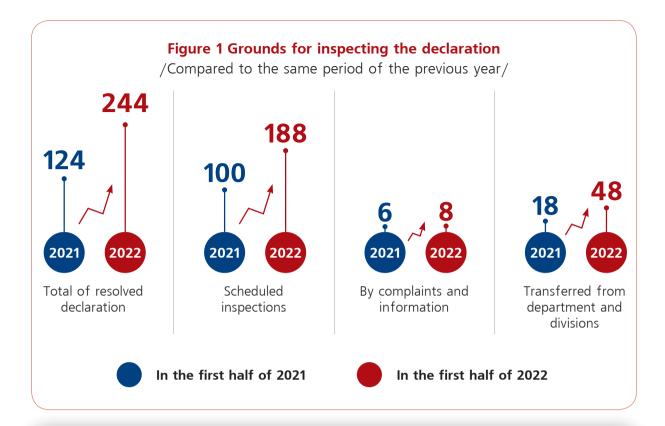
During the reporting period, **188** (**77.0%**) of all applications were inspected per scheduled inspections, **8** (**3.2%**) **per complaints**, and **48** (**19.6%**) were transferred from other departments and divisions.











Compared to the same period of the previous year, the number of declarations inspected by scheduled inspections has increased by **188 units**, the number of declarations inspected by complaints has increased by **2 units** and the number of declarations transferred from other departments and offices has increased by **30 units**.

According to the inspection, a total of 61 officials were warned, their salary was reduced by 30 percent for a period of up to three months, their position was reduced by 30 percent, and their salary was reduced by 30 percent for three months, they were dismissed from their positions or they were dismissed.

Therefore, in the reporting period, **42 applicants** of "Ulaanbaatar Heating System" state-owned company, "Fourth Power Plant", "TOSU" Technology, "Ulaanbaatar Power Supply Power Plant" and General Customs Agency made demands to the authorized organizations and officials. I have received a response about the calculation of the relevant liability.

During the inspection, the income declarations of **15 applicants** were transferred to the Investigation Department.

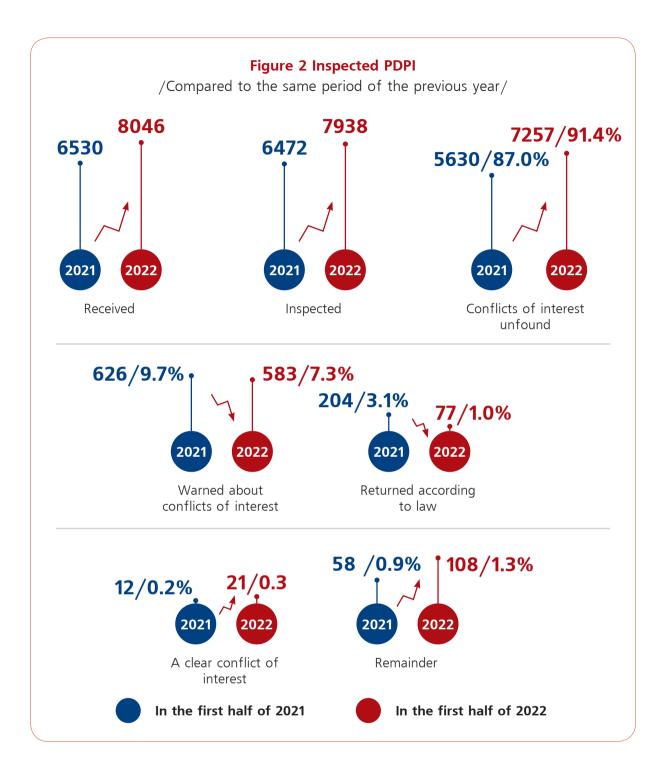
INSPECTION OF THE COMPLAINTS AND INFORMATION

In the first half of 2022, **600 complaints** regarding corruption and conflicts of interest were inspected and resolved. Overall, **93.5 percent** of complaints were resolved.

The complaints and information revealed violations related to **88 officials**, of which **22 officials** were imposed administrative sanctions, **10 complaints** were rejected on the grounds specified in the law, **36** were transferred per criminal nature, **39** were transferred to other organizations according to their jurisdiction, **5 complaints** were recalled by the complainant, **123 complaints' violations** were undetected, **1 complaint** was imposed under the Violation Act, 5 complaints were other.

INSPECTED PRELIMINARY DECLARATIONS OF PERSONAL INTERESTS

During the reporting period, Preliminary Declarations of Personal Interests /PDPI/ of **12,468 candidates' declarations** were inspected and resolved.



Compared to the same period of the previous year, the number of PDPI received increased by **1,516 (23.2%) units.**

RESOLUTION OF CRIMINAL **COMPLAINTS AND INFORMATION**

In the first half of 2022, the IAAC received **954 complaints.** In this regard, **165** complaints were transferred to the relevant government authority following jurisdiction, and **789 complaints** were investigated.

As a result of investigating 789 complaints, opened a criminal inquiry on 313 /32.8%/, refused to open a criminal inquiry on 327 /34.3%/, transferred to the prosecutor's office per jurisdiction on 21 /2.2%/, and 128 complaints are still in investigation with **86.6** percent of the complaints resolved.



Complaints and information about the crime are considered according to the category of related positions:





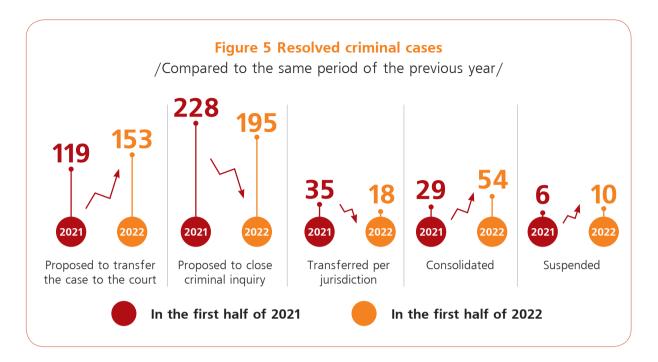
Of the **789 complaints** received and investigated by the Investigation Department, **407** /**51.6%**/ are under the jurisdiction of the Capital city Prosecutor's Department, and **382** /**44.4%**/ are under the jurisdiction of the local Prosecutor's Department.

RESOLUTION OF CRIMINAL CASES

During the reporting period, **1,046 inquiries and investigations** were carried out in **1,246 cases** and **754 suspects** which has decreased by **13.2 percent** compared to the same period of the previous year. /924 in the first half of 2021/

Of the total number of cases investigated, 153 /14.6%/ were referred to prosecution to transfer the case to the court, 195 /18.6%/ were referred to prosecutors to close criminal inquiry, or repeal criminal cases and 18 /1.7%/ were referred to prosecutors to transfer per jurisdiction, 54 cases were consolidated and 10 cases were suspended. There are 534 cases under inquiry and 82 cases under investigation.

40.2 percent of the cases investigated were resolved, and **82 cases** were resolved by the courts.

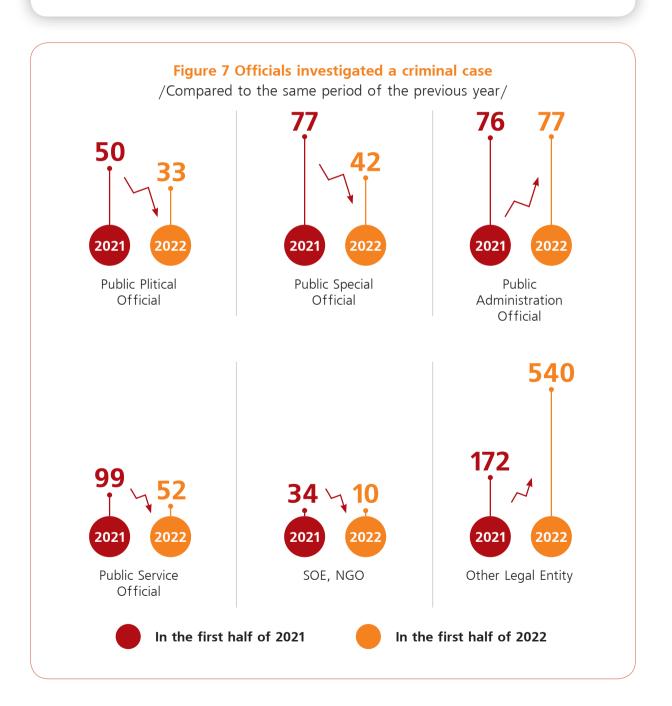

Of the **33** /**4.4**%/ of the officials investigated in connection with the case are Public Political officials, **77** /**10.2**%/ were Public Administrative officials, **42** /**5.6**%/ are Public Special officials, **52** /**6.9**%/ were public service officials, **10** /**1.3**%/ were entities, NGO, and **540** /**71.6**%/ were other legal entity officials.

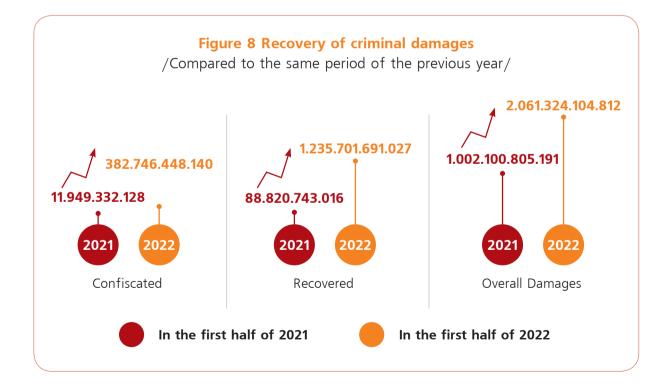


RECOVERY OF CRIMINAL DAMAGES

In the first half of 2022, MNT 2 trillion were lost as a result of the investigated crimes, MNT 1 trillion /60%/ were recovered for damages, and immovable and movable property, housing, apartments, cars, and equipment worth MNT 382 billion valuables and cash were confiscated and protected.

MNT 4 billion of bribery was confiscated and was turned into a state asset.

Compared to the same period of the previous half year, the damages caused by crime increased by **2.1 times**, the recovery for damage increased by **13.9 times**, and confiscated and protected assets increased by **3.4 times**.

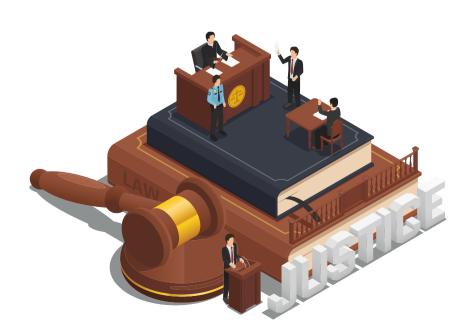


CRIMINAL CASES RESOLVED BY THE COURT

In the first half of 2021, During court below **44 criminal cases** were resolved, and in the first half of 2022, **82 criminal cases** have resolved the court below, an increase of **46.3** compared to the previous year.

IN BRIEF



Signed an MoU with the International Development Law Organization /IDLO/, Romanian National Anticorruption Directorate, Mongolian Football Federation, and the Mongolian National Broadcaster with the purpose to increase the society's affiliation against corruption and take their ideas on preventing and fighting corruption and private interest conflicts and using the media to distribute them, make projects with them to increase innovation and contact between the Mongolian IAAC and the society.



Organized the evaluation team meeting consisting of experts from UNODC, Burkina Faso, and Singapore in Mongolia, regarding the Implementation report of Mongolia on the UN Convention Against Corruption chapter 2 and 5. Officials from 36 organizations participated in the meeting, including the Ministry of Finance, Ministry of Justice and Home Affairs, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Cabinet Secretariat of Government, relevant government organizations, NGOs, private sector representatives, and media organizations.



Mr. Dashdavaa, Director-General of the IAAC met with Ambassador Sebastian Surun of the French Republic in Mongolia on 8 of June 2022 to converse about the success and accomplishments of anti-corruption and the cooperation on jurisdiction for both countries.



Meeting with Mr. Richelieu Lomax, Regional Team Leader, Integrity Vice Presidency, World Bank to exchange ideas on future cooperation, prevent corruption in the World Bank-financed projects, and establish a memorandum of understanding to work closely together. Kevin Mitchell, Director of Compact Operations of the United States Millennium Corporation, Christopher Williams, Chief Anti-Corruption Director, and Deputy Director of the Mongolian Millennium Challenge Fund, held a meeting with Mr. Azjargal, Deputy-Director General of the IAAC to discuss future cooperation, and agreed to cooperate on preventing corruption in the compact contract.



The Capital city of Mongolia, Ulaanbaatar was proposed to join the Global Anti-Corruption Cities Network, a new initiative promoted by the International Anti-Corruption Academy (IACA), and the IAAC will act as the coordinator of the network.



Organized a meeting on cooperation with the "Global Resource for Anti-corruption Education and Youth Empowerment Initiative" presented by the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime in the December of 2021, and discussed future cooperation. At the meeting, it was agreed to use the materials developed in the field of corruption prevention in Mongolia for anti-corruption education and enlightenment, and the primary, secondary, and higher education training modules were obtained in the first instance.



Mr. Azjargal, Deputy-Director General, has been appointed to the working group to improve the Corruption Perception Indicator /index/ issued by Transparency International, approved by the Prime Minister of Mongolia on August 17, 2021, and the working group will implement specific work and measures are implemented to ensure the implementation of the intensive action plan, and the report is delivered.



The Taskforce led by the Deputy Director General of the IAAC worked at "Erdenes Mongolia" LLC within the scope of the powers stipulated in the anti-corruption legislation and is working to present the consolidated task report and related proposals in the third quarter.





The recommendations from the "National Anti-Corruption Conference-2021" organized on the occasion of the International Anti-Corruption Day were delivered to the authorities and officials along with the action plan.



As part of the "Smart Government" project between the World Bank and the Government of Mongolia, electronic systems such as meduuleg.iaac.mn, iad.iaac.mn, e-office, smart.iaac.mn, search.iaac.mn, xacxom.iaac.mn integration, facilitating operations, ensuring information security, updating equipment, and ensuring the normal reliability and security of the system have been initiated. "Digital Works" LLC has been selected and is working to develop the system in two stages to completely update the software, database, hardware, and network organization of the "Electronic Reporting and Inspection System".



Organize the measures included in the national anti-corruption program and its implementation plan, inform the public about the results, coordinate the activities of implementing organizations at the national level, give recommendations, provide professional and methodological assistance, supervise, consolidate reports, monitor and analyze completed the evaluation. In 2021, the implementation of **216** measures included

in the action plan of the national anti-corruption program was 75.0 percent, which is an increase of **6.3** percent compared to the same period of the previous year.



Under Article 26, Section 26.1 of the Anti-Corruption Law, the State Great Khural compiled information on "the implementation of anti-corruption laws and the general situation of corruption in Mongolia", the integrated report of the national anti-corruption program, and the information that was monitored and evaluated. The President of Mongolia, the Prime Minister of Mongolia, the Supreme Court, the Chairman of the General Council of the Judiciary, the State Prosecutor General, the Secretary General of the Office of the State Great Khural, the institutions under the Parliament, Ministries, Government agencies, the Governors of the Capital city and aimags delivered respectively. The information brief was published in English and delivered to international organizations, Embassies of Foreign Countries in Mongolia, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and Embassies of Mongolia in Foreign Countries.



In 2021, a complaint was filed with the General Council of the Judiciary because **22** judges did not accurately declare their assets and income and violated the "Code of Ethics for Judges". it was found that an ethical violation had been committed. The General Council of the Judiciary was informed about this situation and the need to improve the ethics, rule of law, and honesty of judges in the future.



National Audit Office's audit of the 2021 annual budget performance and consolidated financial report of the Budget Portfolio Manager concluded "No violation".



Working to ensure the implementation of the anti-corruption action plan, providing professional and methodological advice, and providing support. According to the evaluation of 2021, the performance of the anti-corruption action plan of 21 aimags was evaluated at an average of **77.6** percent, and that of the ministries at **76.0** percent.



As part of monitoring the services provided by government organizations, investigating whether the bureaucracy is causing delays and ensuring transparency, and taking appropriate measures accordingly, an audit has started a half-yearly analysis of the transparency of the websites of agencies and aimags.



Submitted a report on the work carried out in 2021 with the funding of the Capital city Crime Prevention Coordinating Council and organized the implementation of the work carried out in 2022.



To evaluate the anti-corruption training and promotion work done by the trainers of the Regional Crime Prevention Coordinating Council, to discuss the difficulties and difficulties in the local organization of anti-corruption training and promotion work, and to discuss the work plan to be implemented in 2022 with the trainers held an online meeting.



Regarding the 2020 result of the Worldwide Governance Indicators, the 2022 evaluation of Mongolia by the Bertelsmann Foundation's Transition Index, the International Development Law Organization's (IDLO) "Mongolian Institutional Integrity and Transparency" project proposal and the introduction of a set of measures including improving the methodology of corruption risk assessment of public institutions, translation of manuals, preparation of experts and evaluation, the situation of corruption in the public service, the situation of corruption crimes and violations, its causes, conditions and corruption Measures have been taken to prepare and submit proposals and presentations to authorized organizations and officials.



Accepted the proposal of the NGO "Mongolian Judges' Association", and implemented the 5th goal of the National Anti-Corruption Program "Strengthening the fairness, transparency, and independence of the judiciary and law enforcement agencies, and improving anti-corruption cooperation", and trusting the court's suggestions on issues such as increasing public trust, keeping judges free from corruption and conflicts of interest by adhering to the "Code of Ethics for Judges", and adhering to ethical standards such as declaring personal interests and income declarations as required by the Code of Ethics held an exchange consultation meeting and decided to cooperate in the future.



Research on the acceptability of the theoretical and methodological journal "Justice" published by the organization and all issues since its publication have been uploaded to <u>legaldata.mn</u> and International Standard Serial Number of serialized publications have been officially received (ISSN 2791-3619).



Received the research report after cooperating with the legal entity that provided consulting services for the development of public relations policy documents of the IAAC and monitoring the progress and performance of the research work. The relevant suggestions and information are being verified in the report.



In 2021, new ministries and agencies such as the Ministry of Economy and Development, the Ministry of Digital Development and Communications, the Judicial Disciplinary Committee, the General Department of Education, the Strategic Research Institute, and the National Accreditation Center were established. In connection with the transfer of **28** or a total of **393** officials to the control and regulation office, the number of applicants who updated their 2021 DPIAI reports has increased by **3,861** compared to the previous year.



Among the **311** high-ranking and other government officials who are responsible for registering their declarations at the IAAC, **158** newly appointed and elected officials and **26** officials who have reported major changes have renewed their declarations within the legal period.



Of the total complaints received during the reporting period, 172 /48%/ were submitted from Ulaanbaatar city, and 186 /52%/ percent were submitted from the local area.



In terms of the content of reviewed complaints and information, there were **16** percent abused power, **20.5** percent made illegitimate decisions and gave advantage to others, **21.0** percent made illegitimate decisions and decisions with conflict of interest, and **29.5** made illegitimate appointments.



The situation mentioned in the complaint and information was reviewed, and the 22 officials who violated the law were submitted to the competent authorities and officials to be held responsible, the illegal decision was annulled, and the public was informed and warned about the occurrence of a conflict of interest or the creation of a situation that could be considered a conflict of interest by the public.



The IAAC is providing work directions and recommendations to officials from **66** organizations and monitoring their implementation, including the Cabinet Secretariat, the Ministry of Environment and Tourism, the Ministry of Culture, the Ministry of Education, Science, General Department of Customs, General Department of Civil Aviation, Capital city Governor's Office, Bayangol, Sukhbaatar, Chingeltei District Governor, Arkhangai, Bayan-Olgii, Gobi-Altai, Uvs Aimag Governor's Office.
